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Caring for our seniors is perhaps the greatest responsibility we have. Those who walked before us have given so much, and made possible the life we all enjoy.

To care for those who once cared for us is the highest honor one can have.

June is National Caregivers Month. Patricia Will, the President and originator of Belmont Village, coined the term P.A.L. when opening the first Belmont nearly 20 years ago. She thought that these caregivers are much more than just that - thus the term Personal Assistant Liaison.

When we look around our Community, we also see just that staff who are PALS to residents. and even more than PALS - they become and extension of that resident's family.

Our PALS are with their seniors everyday. They know their residents well, how Mrs. Smith likes to structure her day; what type clothes she likes to wear, styling her hair, how late she likes to sleep or how early she goes to bed. If Mrs. Smith is not feeling well, our PALs are often the first to notice.

To say our staff goes "above and beyond" is a simplistic statement compared to the reality of any given day. These staff members say they are honored to care for the elderly. They don't just

provide physical care, but offer shoulders to lean on or corny jokes to laugh at. They bring in homemade cookies to share with all.

Many of our staff has been with us over 12 years. To me, that speaks volumes of their dedication, not just to being caregivers, but establishing a sense of "family" that sets us apart from other local senior housing communities.

So a special THANK YOU goes out to each of our PALS for their professionalism, compassion and care of our residents!

Not to sidestep Father's Day! Currently at our Community we have a higher than national average number of men living with us. 
### What Colors Say About You
