GEOGRAPHY 101: PLYMOUTH ROCK

Marking the spot where the Pilgrims landed in 1620 to establish an English settlement, Plymouth Rock sits on the shore of Plymouth Harbor in Massachusetts. The historic granite boulder is much smaller than its original size. A relocation in 1774 caused the rock to split in two, and pieces were chipped away for souvenirs. In 1880, the top and bottom halves were reunited and cemented, and the year 1620 was carved into it. Plymouth Rock is part of Pilgrim Memorial State Park, whose waterfront also features a replica of the Mayflower ship.

PLEASE PASS THE PUDDING

You'll probably have pie on Thanksgiving, but the rest of the month is dedicated to a different dessert. Banana Pudding Lovers Month in November celebrates the cool, creamy concoction of vanilla custard, sliced bananas, sponge cake and whipped topping or meringue. The recipe became popular after the Civil War as steamships began bringing more bananas to the U.S., and in the 1920s, store-bought vanilla wafers emerged as a convenient substitute for the dessert's cake laver.

THE CRANBERRY CROP

Turkey, dressing and potatoes are the stars of a traditional Thanksgiving dinner, but a tart red berry deserves attention for its supporting role.

Cranberries grew wild in North America, and early Native Americans used them for food, medicine and as a garment dye. The Pilgrims called the fruit a "craneberry" because the plant's blossoms resemble the head and bill of a crane. Over time, the name evolved into cranberry.

TV commercials and pictures often show cranberries floating in flooded fields, leading many to believe they are grown in water. The berries actually grow on low, trailing vines in sandy bogs or marshes. During harvest season from September to November, the bogs are flooded and machines knock the berries off the vines. Because cranberries have air pockets, they float in the water, making them easier to collect.

About 90 percent of the U.S. cranberry crop is harvested wet. These berries become products such as juices, sauces and dried cranberries. The rest of the crop is harvested dry by using mechanical pickers and is sold as fresh fruit.

In the U.S., northern latitudes provide the best growing conditions for cranberries. Wisconsin, Massachusetts, New Jersey, Oregon and Washington produce most of the crop.



GIVING THANKS TO ANIMAL SHELTERS

Vital resources for the communities they serve, animal shelters are in the spotlight during the first full week of November, which is National Animal Shelter Appreciation Week. The annual observance honors the shelters and numerous dedicated people who work to protect animals.

There are 3,500 animal shelters throughout the United States, serving an estimated 6 to 8 million animals. These shelters provide a temporary home for lost or abandoned pets; educate communities about animal care; and offer spay/neuter services, often at a discounted rate, to help reduce pet overpopulation.

Ways you can say thank you to animal shelters during this week include sharing graphics, posts and other information from local animal shelters with all of your online friends; donating needed items such as towels, toys and food; and making sure your pet wears a collar with updated ID tags or is microchipped. This way, if your pet gets lost, shelter employees will be able to help them return home safely.
